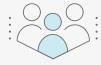

Ben is 25. He grew up in a town right outside Berlin with his Jewish family. They go to the Temple every Saturday.

Since he was a child, he has always enjoyed being helpful as he volunteered for chores at home and assisted his friends with homework. He is a swift learner, loves being around people, and openminded.

Ben likes reading blogs and mainly consumes content on Facebook, Instagram, and LinkedIn. He utilizes social media to keep up with his friends, current world events, and to find new volunteer opportunities.

Two years ago, he got his undergraduate degree in Business Administration at Humboldt University, where he was a student advisor for four semesters. A few days graduation, he stumbled before upon International's **Facebook page**. Unsure of his plan after Humboldt, he expanded his online research on this particular nonprofit. He realized this organization would be an ideal place to start his career journey. Ben would strengthen his professional development thanks to L'Arche's three-month training program for new assistants, and positively impact other people's lives. He immediately decided to move to Tecklenburg, Germany, where L'Arche has a community, and he became a live-in assistant.

He found an apartment very close to his new workplace, became close friends with Sven, a 53-year-old core person, and found an inclusive, welcoming environment that he calls his "second home."

After 13 months of caregiving at L'Arche Tecklenburg community, Ben was ready for a new opportunity. He enjoyed his time in this country; however, he only wanted to live abroad for a limited period. He wanted to have a positive impact on other L'Arche communities and explore a different city and culture. He took advantage of L'Arche International Experience Program and moved to Washington, DC. This program guaranteed Ben's insurance coverage, a stipend, and the possibility of housing with reduced rent fees.
